Children with a medical home



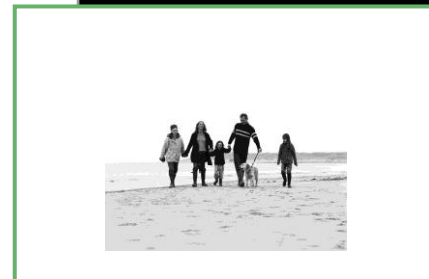
## Every Florida child is ready to learn and succeed

Early childhood staff with bachelor's degrees

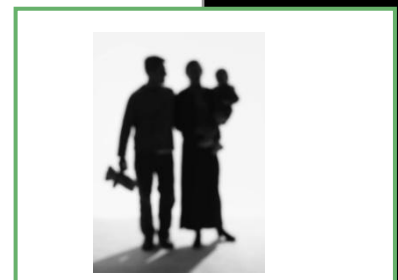
