"FOCUS ON FLORIDA'S FUTURE" BUDGET

Florida is **REDUCING** overall state spending next fiscal year while still making record investments for Floridians as highlighted below.

The Florida FY 2024-2025 budget will total \$116.5 billion, a reduction in spending from the previous year, and retain a budget surplus of \$17 billion.

Since taking office, Governor Ron DeSantis has successfully reduced the state's outstanding debt by \$6.3 billion, or 36% of the state's total debt.
