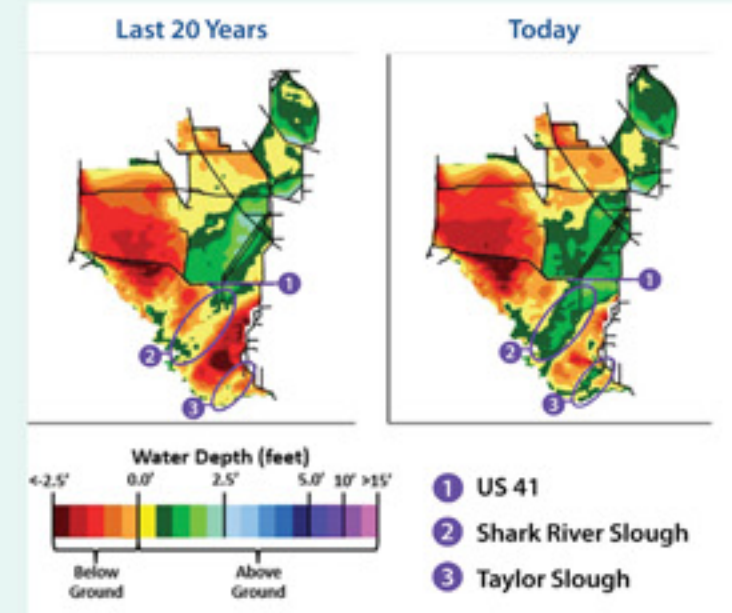
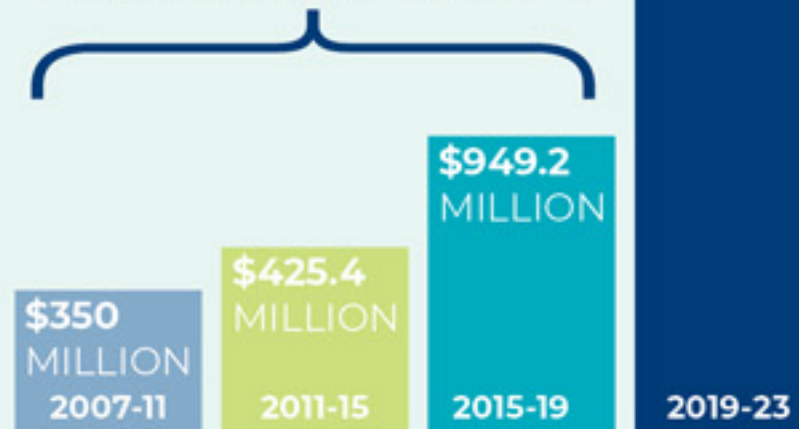
PROTECTING FLORIDA TOGETHER

Record \$3.3 billion for Everglades Restoration and Protection of Water Resources

EVERGLADES RESTORATION \$1.7 BILLION

- More than 50 projects completed, broken-ground or hit major milestones.
- Record water volumes being sent south to hydrate the Everglades, resulting in Florida Bay reaching salinity goals for the first time in decades.
- Significantly reduced discharges.
- Over half of the more than 17,000 invasive Burmese pythons removed since 2000 have been removed in the last four years.

WATER QUALITY IMPROVEMENTS \$1.6 BILLION

- **Indian River Lagoon (IRL)** - 130 projects for a total of more than \$255 million investment in the IRL Region. Estimate of more than 163,000 pounds of total phosphorus (TP) and 610,000 pounds of total nitrogen (TN) reductions reported, per year.
- **Biscayne Bay** - \$52 million investment in water quality protection projects.
- **Springs** - 118 projects for a total of more than \$275 million investment. Estimate of more than 599,135 pounds of TN reductions, per year.
- **Alternative Water Supply** - \$170 million invested in projects to generate 272 million gallons per day of water.
- **Innovative Technologies and Red Tide Cleanup** - \$50 million.

WATER QUALITY MONITORING AND INNOVATIVE TECHNOLOGIES

- Dedicated funding for better detection and remediation of harmful algal blooms.
- Increased red tide sampling by 68% and doubled offshore sampling trips, where red tide originates.
- More than 280 new and enhanced water quality monitoring stations with a focus on Lake Okeechobee, surrounding estuaries and Indian River Lagoon.
- Invested in more than 30 innovative technology projects focused on harmful algal bloom prediction and mitigation.

STATEWIDE RESILIENCE MORE THAN \$1.1 BILLION

- Created the Resilient Florida Program to help prepare communities for the impacts of flooding and intensified storm events.
- Funded more than 200 resilience projects including all projects identified in the state's first ever three-year Statewide Flooding Resilience Plan.
- Awarded 90 grants statewide to develop and update comprehensive vulnerability assessments.
- Appointed the state's first Chief Resilience Officer to coordinate efforts.

ENVIRONMENTAL CRIMES ENFORCEMENT

- Doubled fines for sanitary sewer overflows and increased other penalties by 50%.
- Held environmental polluters accountable with more than 105 felony arrests and over 400 misdemeanors.

PRIZED PROPERTIES AND OUTDOOR RECREATION

- Established the Florida Wildlife Corridor.
- Invested \$600 million for land acquisition, including \$300 million specifically for the Wildlife Corridor.
- Acquired nearly 153,877 acres (108,110 acres more than previous four years). Approximately 94% of these acres are within the Wildlife Corridor.
- Record \$407 million invested in Florida's award-winning state parks (\$270 million more than previous four years).
- Provided longest summer and fall Gulf Red Snapper seasons since the state assumed management.

MANATEE PROTECTION MORE THAN \$50 MILLION

- Record funding to enhance and expand manatee rescue and rehabilitation efforts and provide habitat restoration for areas where manatees are highly concentrated.
