



Human Trafficking knows no bounds. This modern-day form of slavery claims victims of all ages, sex, ethnicities, and demographics. You can save a life by knowing the signs and reporting the crime.



# KNOW THE SIGNS

## PHYSICAL

- Branding-scars, burns, or tattoos
- Malnourished
- Serious dental issues
- Disoriented or confused
- Other physical signs of abuse

## VERBAL

- Responds as if coached
- Allows someone else to speak for them
- Reluctant to discuss their injuries
- Fearful, anxious, or paranoid

## MEDICAL

- Urinary difficulties
- Pelvic pain
- Rectal Trauma
- Chronic cardio or respiratory problems
- Drug addiction
- Infections
- Sleep Deprivation

# State Of Florida

## RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the United States was founded on the principle that all people are born with an unalienable right to freedom and liberty and human rights are fundamental principles of our country; and

WHEREAS, human trafficking is the business of stealing freedom for profit through forced labor, debt bondage, servitude and commercial sexual exploitation; and

WHEREAS, human trafficking is a multi-billion-dollar criminal industry with over 20 million victims around the world of which, two million victims could be in the United States; and

WHEREAS, the victims of human trafficking are citizens and immigrants, men, women and children; and

WHEREAS, the State of Florida continues to be a national leader in awareness, training, services and legislative efforts to combat this crime; and

WHEREAS, safe houses providing much needed care and services continue to open in our state; and

WHEREAS, Florida now has state supported task forces in all 20 Florida judicial circuits offering important connections and communication statewide; and

WHEREAS, the Statewide Council on Human Trafficking has allowed increased state, local, national and international cooperation to eradicate human trafficking; and

WHEREAS, the Statewide Council on Human Trafficking allows state leaders to come together to help victims and survivors of human trafficking by establishing an appropriate and caring environment for recovery.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Governor and Cabinet of the State of Florida do hereby recognize January 2020, as

### NATIONAL HUMAN TRAFFICKING AWARENESS MONTH

in Florida and commend law enforcement, local governments and communities, and citizens for their support and efforts in combating this atrocious crime and for remaining vigilant and cognizant of the issue in order to protect citizens and visitors of our great State.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF the Governor and Cabinet of the State of Florida have hereunto subscribed their names and have caused the Official Seal of the State of Florida to be hereunto affixed in the City of Tallahassee this the 1<sup>st</sup> day of January, 2020.

## Human Trafficking is the biggest industry you have never heard of.

According to the International Labor Organization, forced labor and Human Trafficking is a **\$150B** industry globally with an estimated **40.3M** victims worldwide.

Human trafficking is defined under Florida law as the recruitment, harboring, transportation, provision, or obtaining of a person for labor or services, through the use of force, fraud, or coercion.
