What is the Summer BreakSpot?

- Provides nutritious meals at no cost to children 18 and under while school is out for the summer;
- Operates at schools, non-profit organizations and government entities, such as parks and libraries; and
- Reimburses participating organizations for meals through the USDA's Summer Food Service Program or Seamless Summer Option.

What role does the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services play?

- Provides guidance, support and training for program sponsors;
- Distributes funds from USDA to reimburse sponsors for meals served;
- Promotes site locations and meal times through 2-1-1, SummerFoodFlorida.org and a texting service; and
- Identifies areas of need to help sponsors determine site locations.

How can organizations help?

- Become a Summer BreakSpot sponsor and serve nutritious meals to children;
- Offer your facilities as a site location for other organizations to provide the meals;
- Publicize the program to families with newsletters, mailings and through digital communications; and
- Visit FreshFromFlorida.com/RoadmaptoHealth to see where service and resource gaps exist in your community.

The Summer BreakSpot bridges the nutrition gap for more than 1 million Florida children at risk of going hungry while school is out.
