## OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR EXECUTIVE ORDER NUMBER 13-299 (Executive Order of Removal)

**WHEREAS**, Jennifer G. Hill, is presently serving as a Notary Public of the State of Florida; and

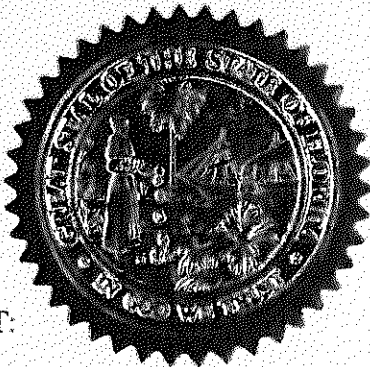
**WHEREAS**, on or about September 11, 2013, Jennifer G. Hill entered a plea of nolo contendere to possession of Oxycodone, a third-degree felony, in violation of Section 893.13(6)(a), Florida Statutes; and

**WHEREAS**, Section 112.52(3), Florida Statutes, provides that any person who pleads nolo contendere is deemed to have been convicted of a felony, and authorizes the Governor to remove the public official from office by executive order; and


**WHEREAS**, it is in the best interests of the citizens of the State of Florida, that Jennifer G. Hill be immediately removed from the public office, which she now holds, upon the grounds set forth in this executive order.

**NOW, THEREFORE, I, RICK SCOTT**, Governor of Florida, pursuant to section 112.52(3), Florida Statutes, issue the following executive order, effective immediately:

Section 1. Jennifer G. Hill is hereby removed from the public office of Notary Public.
