EXECUTIVE ORDER NUMBER 16-14

WHEREAS, the Honorable JEFFREY L. ASHTON, State Attorney for the Ninth Judicial Circuit of Florida, has advised Governor RICK SCOTT that Tavon Jackson has been charged with violation of probation; and

WHEREAS, the Honorable PHIL ARCHER, State Attorney for the Eighteenth Judicial Circuit of Florida, handled the original case, under Executive Order 13-48, for which the defendant received a probationary sentence, and a subsequent charge of violation of probation under Executive Order 14-174; and

WHEREAS, the Honorable JEFFREY L. ASHTON has also advised the Governor that original conflict continues to exist because he was counsel on record in this case prior to his election as state attorney; and

WHEREAS, the Honorable JEFFREY L. ASHTON, to avoid a conflict of interest or any appearance of impropriety, has voluntarily disqualified himself and has requested the executive assignment of another State Attorney with respect to the investigation and prosecution of this case and all related matters; and

WHEREAS, the Honorable PHIL ARCHER, State Attorney for the Eighteenth Judicial Circuit of Florida, has agreed to accept an executive assignment in this matter; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the State of Florida and of the ends of justice that the Honorable PHIL ARCHER discharge the duties of the Honorable JEFFREY L. ASHTON, pursuant to section 27.14, Florida Statutes.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, RICK SCOTT, Governor of Florida, in obedience to my solemn constitutional duty to “take care that the laws be faithfully executed,” and pursuant to the Constitution and laws of the State of Florida, issue the following Executive Order, effective immediately:

Section 1.

The Honorable PHIL ARCHER, State Attorney for the Eighteenth Judicial Circuit of Florida, referred to as the “Assigned State Attorney,” is assigned to discharge the duties of the Honorable JEFFREY L. ASHTON, State Attorney for the Ninth Judicial Circuit of Florida, as they relate to the investigation, prosecution, and all matters related to Tavon Jackson.

Section 2.

The Assigned State Attorney or one or more Assistant State Attorneys and Investigators, who have been designated by the Assigned State Attorney, shall proceed immediately to the Ninth Judicial Circuit of Florida, and are vested with the authority to perform the duties prescribed herein.

Section 3.

All residents of the Ninth Judicial Circuit are requested, and all public officials are directed, to cooperate and render whatever assistance is necessary to the Assigned State Attorney, so that justice may be served.

Section 4.

The period of this Executive Assignment shall be for one (1) year, to and including January 22, 2017.

Section 5.

The Assigned State Attorney shall notify the Governor on or before December 22, 2016, if additional time is required.
