EXECUTIVE ORDER NUMBER 17-220

(Emergency Management – Termination of Executive Order 17-204)

WHEREAS, on July 31, 2017, I issued Executive Order 17-204 due to the threat that Tropical Storm Emily posed to the State; and

WHEREAS, around 10:45 a.m. on July 31, 2017, Tropical Storm Emily made landfall on Anna Maria Island, bringing winds of 45 mph and several inches of rain; and

WHEREAS, later in the evening, the National Hurricane Center downgraded Tropical Storm Emily to a tropical depression; and

WHEREAS, the National Hurricane Center issued its last advisory regarding the storm system on August 2, 2017; and

WHEREAS, the danger posed by Tropical Storm Emily, including localized flash flooding, has abated; and

WHEREAS, the conditions warranting a state of emergency as it relates to Tropical Storm Emily have now ceased to exist;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, RICK SCOTT, as Governor of Florida, by virtue of the authority vested in me by Article IV, Section 1(a) of the Florida Constitution and by the Florida Emergency Management Act, as amended, and all other applicable laws, promulgate the following Executive Order, to take immediate effect:

Section 1. Executive Order 17-204 is terminated as of this date.

Section 2. Nothing in the Order shall be construed to affect the validity of any action taken or obligation incurred in reliance upon Executive Order 17-204 while in effect.
