EXECUTIVE ORDER NUMBER 17-256

WHEREAS, the Honorable KATHERINE FERNANDEZ RUNDLE, State Attorney for the Eleventh Judicial Circuit of Florida, was previously assigned by Executive Order 16-232 to the Seventeenth Judicial Circuit of Florida to represent the State of Florida concerning charges pending against Eddie Sabastain Mosley; and

WHEREAS, the Assigned State Attorney has advised the Governor that the duties required by the previous executive assignment have not yet been completed as the case is in discovery phase and a trial date has not yet been set; and

WHEREAS, the Assigned State Attorney has further advised the Governor that an extension of this assignment is necessary in order to complete the assigned duties; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the State of Florida and of the ends of justice that the assignment of the Assigned State Attorney be continued with respect to the above matters, pursuant to section 27.14, Florida Statutes.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, RICK SCOTT, Governor of Florida, in obedience to my solemn constitutional duty to "take care that the laws be faithfully executed," and pursuant to the Constitution and laws of the State of Florida, issue the following Executive Order:

Section 1.

Executive Order 16-232 is reaffirmed and the executive assignment is extended for an additional period of one (1) year, to and including October 13, 2018.

Section 2.

The Assigned State Attorney shall notify the Governor on or before September 13, 2018, if additional time is required.

APPLICATION FOR APPROVAL OF EXTENDED ASSIGNMENT


RICK SCOTT, Governor of Florida, files this application pursuant to Section 27.14, Florida Statutes, for an order approving an extension of the executive assignment of a State Attorney for an additional period of one (1) year. In support of this application, it is respectfully shown:

1. By Executive Order 16-232, the Honorable KATHERINE FERNANDEZ RUNDLE, the State Attorney for the Eleventh Judicial Circuit, was assigned to the Seventeenth Judicial Circuit of Florida to represent the State of Florida concerning charges pending against Eddie Sabastain Mosley.
2. The Assigned State Attorney has advised the Governor that the duties required by the previous executive assignment have not yet been completed as the case is in discovery phase and a trial date has not yet been set.
3. The Assigned State Attorney has further advised the Governor that an extension of this assignment is necessary in order to complete the duties prescribed therein.
4. As evidenced by the terms of Executive Order 17-256, a copy of which is attached hereto, it has been found and determined that it is in the best interests of the State of Florida and of the ends of justice that Executive Order 16-232 be extended for an additional period of one (1) year, with approval of this Honorable Court, pursuant to the provisions of section 27.14, Florida Statutes.

WHEREFORE, this Honorable Court is requested to approve an extension of the executive assignment of the Assigned State Attorney for an additional period of one (1) year, to and including October 13, 2018.
