### EXECUTIVE ORDER NUMBER 18-61

WHEREAS, the Honorable JEFFREY A. SIEGMEISTER, State Attorney for the Third Judicial Circuit of Florida, has advised Governor RICK SCOTT that an Order setting an Evidentiary Hearing on a motion for post-conviction relief has been filed in the case of State of Florida vs. Donald Wilson; and

WHEREAS, the State Attorney for the Second Judicial Circuit handled the original case under Executive Orders 13-65 and 14-46; and

WHEREAS, the Honorable JEFFREY A. SIEGMEISTER has also advised the Governor that the original conflict continues to exist as he represented Donald Wilson prior to being elected State Attorney; and

WHEREAS, the Honorable JEFFREY A. SIEGMEISTER, to avoid a conflict of interest or any appearance of impropriety, has voluntarily disqualified himself and has requested the executive assignment of another State Attorney with respect to the motion for post-conviction relief and all related matters; and

WHEREAS, the Honorable JACK CAMPBELL, State Attorney for the Second Judicial Circuit of Florida, has agreed to accept an executive assignment in this matter; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the State of Florida and of the ends of justice that the Honorable JACK CAMPBELL discharge the duties of the Honorable JEFFREY A. SIEGMEISTER, pursuant to section 27.14, Florida Statutes.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, RICK SCOTT, Governor of Florida, in obedience to my solemn constitutional duty to “take care that the laws be faithfully executed,” and pursuant to the Constitution and laws of the State of Florida, issue the following Executive Order, effective immediately:

Section 1.

The Honorable JACK CAMPBELL, State Attorney for the Second Judicial Circuit of Florida, referred to as the “Assigned State Attorney,” is assigned to discharge the duties of the Honorable JEFFREY A. SIEGMEISTER, State Attorney for the Third Judicial Circuit of Florida, as they relate to the motion for post-conviction relief and all matters related to Donald Wilson.

Section 2.

The Assigned State Attorney or one or more Assistant State Attorneys and Investigators, who have been designated by the Assigned State Attorney, shall proceed immediately to the Third Judicial Circuit of Florida, and are vested with the authority to perform the duties prescribed herein.

Section 3.


All residents of the Third Judicial Circuit are requested, and all public officials are directed, to cooperate and render whatever assistance is necessary to the Assigned State Attorney, so that justice may be served.

Section 4.

The period of this Executive Assignment shall be for one (1) year, to and including March 13, 2019.

Section 5.

The Assigned State Attorney shall notify the Governor on or before February 13, 2019, if additional time is required.
