EXECUTIVE ORDER NUMBER 21-113

(Extension of State Attorney Executive Assignment)

WHEREAS, the Honorable NICHOLAS B. COX, Statewide Prosecutor in the Office of the Attorney General, referred to as the “Assigned State Attorney,” was previously assigned by Executive Order 20-140 to the Twelfth Judicial Circuit of Florida to represent the State of Florida concerning and investigation of Devante Brown and Johnny Ordaz for homicide; and

WHEREAS, the Assigned State Attorney has advised the Governor that the duties required by the previous executive assignment have not yet been completed as the investigation is almost complete and a charging decision is imminent; and

WHEREAS, the Assigned State Attorney has further advised the Governor that an extension of this assignment is necessary in order to complete the assigned duties; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the State of Florida and of the ends of justice that the assignment of the Assigned State Attorney be continued with respect to the above matters, pursuant to section 27.14, Florida Statutes.


NOW, THEREFORE, I, RON DESANTIS, Governor of Florida, in obedience to my solemn constitutional duty to “take care that the laws be faithfully executed,” and pursuant to the Constitution and laws of the State of Florida, issue the following Executive Order:

Section 1. Executive Order 20-140 is reaffirmed and the executive assignment is extended for an additional period of one (1) year, to and including June 15, 2022.

Section 2. The Assigned State Attorney shall notify the Governor on or before May 15, 2022, if additional time is required.
