



38-2007-CF-636-A State v. [REDACTED] Circuit Court, 8th Judicial Circuit (Levy County), Judge Stan Morris, prosecutor was Glenn Bryan [REDACTED]. The verdict was rendered on 5-29-09. I handled the entirety of the defense. [REDACTED] is a high school teacher and football coach in Enterprise, Alabama. He was charged with lewd and lascivious molestation of a child under 12 years old and three counts of sexual battery, and was facing what amounted to a life sentence if convicted. The alleged victim was the daughter of his ex-wife and made allegations in both Florida and Alabama over a six year period. Alabama revoked [REDACTED] license to teach when he was arrested. After a three day trial, he was acquitted of all charges. I showed a six person jury, which included three correctional officers, that the allegations were made after Mr. [REDACTED] refused to buy the alleged victim a new car and refused to give his ex-wife \$25,000.00. The Alabama charges were dismissed after the acquittal in Florida. Mr. [REDACTED] teaching license has been reinstated and he is again teaching and coaching football in the Enterprise, Alabama school system.

[REDACTED]-A State v [REDACTED] Alachua County Circuit Court, 8th Judicial Circuit, Judge Martha Ann Lott, tried 6-23-08. Opposing counsel was Kristin Pickens (352-374-3670). I handled the entirety of the defense. [REDACTED], a UF student majoring in Forest Resources, was charged with arson and three counts of battery on a law enforcement officer for allegedly setting his apartment on fire and barricading himself in the apartment. He also was alleged to have attacked law enforcement when officers attempted to enter the apartment. His family lives in Indiana and they called me after he was arrested. When I went to see [REDACTED] at the jail, he was in the infirmary on suicide watch in a cell that consisted of a mattress on the floor, and he was dressed in a one piece garment that barely covered his body. He suffered injuries from the incident and it was clear he had suffered a mental breakdown (later determined to be a manic episode due to bipolar disorder). I was able to arrange for a psychiatrist to see him the day after he was arrested. [REDACTED] was immediately transferred to a private mental health facility in Ocala after an emergency hearing. Following several weeks at the hospital, he was released to his family until resolution of the case. He was found not guilty by reason of insanity and Judge Lott placed him on a conditional release plan. There have been many ups and downs for [REDACTED] since his breakdown, but he is again a student in college. This case was significant because mental health issues are common, particularly in the criminal justice system, and there are better remedies than housing the mentally ill in jail.

01-2002-CF-4394-A State v. Joseph Piser, Alachua County Circuit Court, 8th Judicial Circuit, Judge Phyllis Kotey, tried 4-29-03. Opposing counsel was Geoffrey Fleck (678-664-2241) at trial, and the prosecutor that handled the case up to trial was Jay Welch

(retired, last known number [REDACTED]). I handled the entirety of the defense. Mr. Piser was a homeless man charged with burglary with a battery, a first degree felony punishable by life and faced a potential life sentence. The alleged victim testified that Mr. Piser entered her home and attempted to sexually assault her. He was convicted of a lesser charge (assault, a second degree misdemeanor) and was sentenced to the maximum of 60 days jail for which he had credit for time already served. Before trial everyone assumed he was guilty because the alleged victim, a homeowner, was accusing the homeless man known as "Crazy Joe" with an extensive criminal record. The alleged victim asserted she barely knew Mr. Piser, and he had not been to her house before. At trial, we showed that Mr. Piser had been to the home several times at the alleged victim's invitation, and they knew each other much better than originally asserted by the alleged victim. In fact, it was proven that the alleged victim made these allegations because another man she was in a relationship with had become suspicious of Mr. Piser's visit. This case was significant because it highlights the fact that parties in cases may have ulterior motives for the testimony they give in court, and an attorney must investigate the case thoroughly. It reinforced the position that when you represent a client you cannot make assumptions.

01-2007-CF-1018-B State v. Alonzo Liddie, Alachua County Circuit Court, 8th Judicial Circuit, Judge Peter Sieg, defendant pled no contest on 10-29-08. Original prosecutor was Brian Kramer [REDACTED]. The case was resolved with prosecutor James Colow [REDACTED]. I handled the entirety of the defense. Mr. Liddie was indicted for first degree murder, armed home invasion robbery, and conspiracy. He faced a mandatory life sentence if convicted either first degree murder or armed home invasion robbery as a recent releasee from prison. The allegation was that Mr. Liddie went with his co-defendant to the home of the alleged victim, a known drug dealer, to collect money and drugs owed to the co-defendant. Mr. Liddie was alleged to have entered the house as protection and to act as a lookout when a gun fight occurred between the alleged victim and the co-defendant. The State offered Mr. Liddie 20 years in prison for his plea and testimony against the co-defendant. He maintained his innocence and the case was resolved on the verge of trial, with Mr. Liddie pleading to accessory after the fact for driving away from the crime scene. He received a 5 year prison sentence followed by probation. The murder, home invasion robbery, and conspiracy charges were dismissed. The co-defendant received a 25 year prison sentence. The case was significant for demonstrating that just being near a crime scene does not make an individual guilty of committing all crimes that occur. A thorough investigation revealed that Mr. Liddie had merely driven the co-defendant to the house where the crime occurred with no knowledge of the co-defendant's intent.

01-2005-DR-3076 In Re: The Marriage of William Todd Ice and Kimberly Ice (dissolution of marriage). Opposing counsel was Margaret Anderson (352-375-6897) until she was permitted to withdraw prior to final judgment. I handled the entirety of Ms. Ice's cases. Ms. Ice originally hired me to represent her in a divorce case in August, 2005. Her husband was seeking a divorce. While negotiating the divorce, Mr. Ice's girlfriend, Victoria Carlisle, made allegations that Ms. Ice had attempted to shoot her in September, 2005. Ms. Ice, who worked for a local insurance agent, did not have funds to hire me on the subsequent cases resulting from the alleged shooting, so I represented her pro bono for cases 01-2005-CF-4258-A, State v. Kimbely Ice, felony criminal case for shooting into an occupied dwelling (opposing counsels were Rose Mary Treadway and Sean Brewer (352-374-3760), and 01-2005-DR-4176 Victoria Carlisle v. Kimberly Ice

(injunction against violence). I represented her on the related cases without compensation because Ms. Ice was being accused of serious allegations which were fabricated and it was important that she have counsel. The felony charges were dismissed in November, 2005 after we convinced the prosecution that the allegations were made by Mr. Ice's girlfriend to influence the divorce case. The petition for injunction was dismissed by Judge Mark Moseley after a hearing in November, 2005. I resolved Ms. Ice's divorce with her remaining in the marital home and having primary residential custody of the three children. These cases were significant because it showed how parties can make false allegations in an attempt to manipulate the legal system to their benefit, and experienced legal counsel can prevent such an injustice.

01-1990-CF-1203-A State v. Marion Allen Burden, Alachua County Circuit Court, 8th Judicial Circuit, Judge Thomas Elwell, opposing counsel was Thomas Jaworski (352-374-3650). I prepared the defense case and was co-counsel (with Robert Trenkle, 719-593-1239) at trial that occurred 2-20-1991. Mr. Burden was charged with attempted first degree murder for allegedly shooting the victim in the head after an argument. The victim suffered brain damage and memory loss due to the injuries, but testified at trial that the last thing he remembered was the defendant standing over him and pointing a gun at his head. This case was significant because it was one of my first felony trials in which the defendant could have been sentenced to prison for the rest of his life and I had only been a lawyer for 7 months. The case taught me the importance of expert testimony and prior inconsistent statements of witnesses. The victim's testimony at trial was substantially different than at deposition when he testified he had no recollection of anything concerning the incident. Mr. Burden was acquitted at trial.


